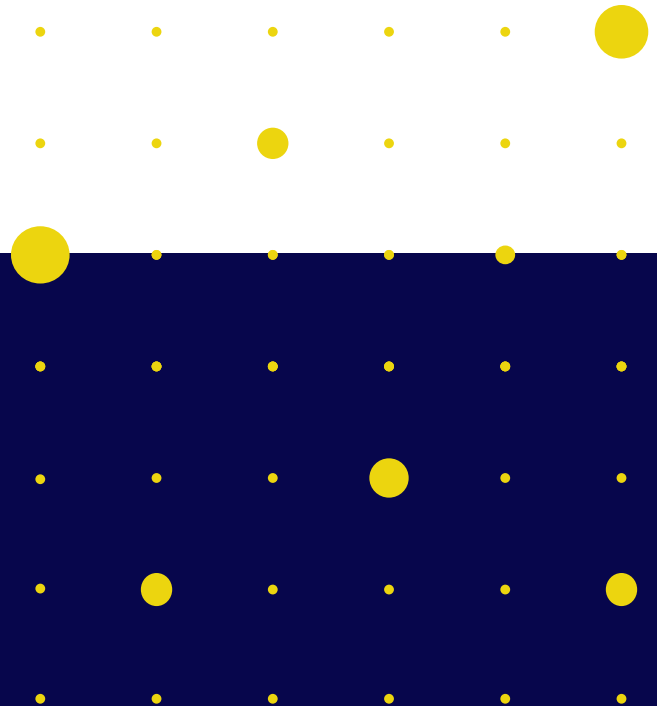

What is the National Occupation Classification (NOC) Mapping Guide?

The Legislated Employment Equity Program (LEEP) requires federally regulated private-sector employers with 100 or more employees to report employment equity-related data once a year. This includes identifying the appropriate NOC code for each employee in the WEIMS portal. There are 45 general NOC codes that organize and provide categories for different job titles.

This document acts as a NOC code mapping guide for trucking and logistics companies. It will help you determine which NOC codes best describe the jobs in your company, making the LEEP reporting process easier and more efficient.



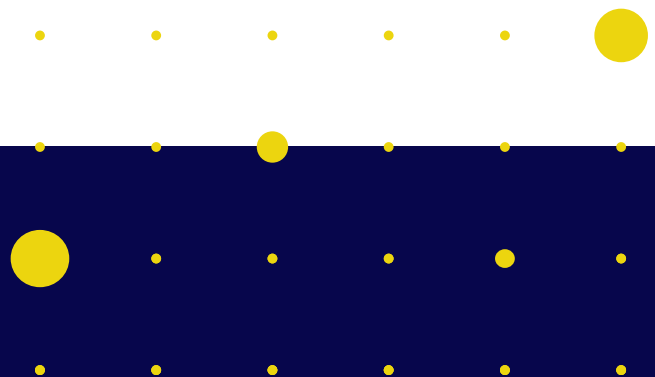
How does the NOC Mapping Guide Work?

Below you will find a table of contents outlining the NOC codes that are most relevant for the trucking and logistics industry, as well as a list of job titles under each code representing the range of job titles that could fall under that NOC code. The mapping guide is organized into 10 divisions: Senior management, operations, finance, business development sales and marketing, human resources, planning and engineering, information technology, legal, environment, and administration.

The best way to use the mapping guide is to use the control “f” function or similar shortcut on your computer to search the job title you are looking for. You may also use the table of contents to scroll to the division of the job you had in mind and look through the associated job titles to get a sense of the type of jobs that are included. This is especially helpful if you can’t find the exact job title of the position in mind, as there are many examples provided. Once you find your preferred job title, or a job title that similar to the one your company uses, click on it and you will be taken to an explanation of the NOC code in this guide. This explanation allows you to verify that the NOC code description matches the job in question. Sometimes jobs with the same titles can mean very different things, which is why it is important to double check the description of the NOC code before including it in your report.

If you can’t find an appropriate job title, try clicking on the NOC code header in the body of the document to visit the NOC website published by the Government of Canada. The descriptions in this Guide have been adapted for the trucking industry, but more detailed unit group characteristics can be found on the Government’s site.

Please note that NOC codes do not distinguish between “manager” and “senior manager”. If you have a job title that includes senior manager, look for the same title but without the “senior”. Team lead and supervisor can be used interchangeably if they both supervise one or more employees.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees establish objectives for the company and formulate policies and programs to drive forward the success of the organization. They oversee departments and the senior staff that oversee those departments. They typically have control over human and financial resources such as staffing and budgeting. They are representatives of the company.

These employees typically have a university degree in commerce, business, or a related degree. They have several years of experience managing employees and have specializations regarding their field, such as an accounting designation for financial professionals.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

Managers in transportation are employees that plan and provide direction regarding operations within a department or region in a trucking and logistics company. They oversee operations, policy adherence, and typically will have some influence on the company or department's budget. Oftentimes, their roles involve managing a team by recruiting new employees and overseeing their training. A bachelor's degree and several years of supervisory experience in the industry is usually a requirement for this role.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees supervise, plan, assign and review the work of clerks engaged in the following duties: shipping, receiving, storing, distributing, and maintaining inventories of materials, parts and products; processing purchasing transactions; coordinating production work; dispatching crews; scheduling transportation crews and routes; and other related activities. They ensure compliance with policies, procedures for safety and security, standards and regulations in force and participate in their improvement. Most employees have completed a college or university program in business or supply chain and have several years of experience within their specialty.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

Supervisors, motor transport, and other ground transit operators supervise and coordinate the work of truck drivers. They typically have had to complete high school and need several years of experience as a driver.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These truck drivers operate trucks and tractor-trailers both over short and long distances. They are required to have several certifications, such as Class 3/D license, Class 1 or A license, Air Brakes Endorsements, or TDG certifications, as well as require on the job training. Certain truck drivers do not fall into this category — If the driver in question supervises and coordinate the work of other truck drivers, see NOC 7305.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These labourers assist truck and delivery drivers to load and unload vehicles and perform labouring duties in warehouses. Only some secondary school education is required.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees plan and oversee the operational logistics of an organization's supply chain. They typically communicate regularly with production coordinators, warehouse and production supervisors, etc. to coordinate activities between warehouses and other departments. They coordinate and monitor logistics of the movement of parts, supplies and materials within an establishment and ensure that supplies, materials, and products are shipped and received on schedule. Typically, these positions require a post-secondary diploma that is around two years in length, in areas such as supply chain management or business.

Most have completed their high school education, and some experience in a similar clerical or warehouse position may be required.

Typically, these employees have completed high school and have several years of experience in transportation.

Most roles in this category have some involvement with managing a team, such as performing hiring, training, and supervisory activities. Most employees in this code have a bachelor's degree in business, or a related field, and potentially a specialized post-graduate degree or diploma in finance. Those who are certified accounting or finance professionals also require an accounting or financial designation.

They have typically completed a college program related to bookkeeping/accounting.

Almost all accountants or financial auditors require a university degree and completion of their chartered designation (CPA, CMA, CA, etc).

Their studies and evaluations cover areas such as takeover bids, private placements, mergers, or acquisitions. Most employees in these roles have a bachelor's degree in business or a related field, their Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) designation, and/or a master's degree in business.

Most employees have a university degree or college diploma in their field.

They might review and adapt to information regarding product innovations, competitors, and market conditions. These employees typically have experience in sales and have completed high school. Some may have a university degree or college diploma.

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees sell, rent a range of technical and non-technical services directly to consumers. They have a variety of different education and experience levels, ranging from a high school diploma to a university degree in business.

They represent management and participate actively on various joint committees to maintain ongoing relations between management and employees. Typically, these employees have a relevant bachelor's degree, several years of experience in human resources, and hold their certified human resources designation.

*Note: This NOC code has overlapping titles with NOC 1223. Employees who fall into this NOC category typically are more focused on HR strategy. While they still may perform similar duties in 1223, such as recruiting, they focus on the bigger strategy within recruitment and other HR areas. These employees are more likely to have a university degree over a college diploma.

*Note: This NOC code has overlapping titles with NOC 1121. Employees who fall into this NOC category typically are more focused on following pre-established HR processes, rather than developing HR strategies. For example, instead of creating a staffing strategy, they are the employees who screen, interview, and select candidates. These employees are more likely to have a college diploma over a university degree.

Truck mechanics adjust, repair, or replace parts and components of commercial transport truck or trailer systems including chassis, frame, cab, body, engine and drive train, air brakes, steering, and fuel, hydraulic, electrical and electronic systems. These roles typically require completion of high school and a transport mechanic apprenticeship, as well as their trade certification dependent on province. Red seal mechanics would also fall into this category.

They also can have control of the budget and expenditures of the department, company or project. - Manager of environment & sustainability

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees plan, organize, direct, control, and evaluate the research, development or production activities of a scientific research surrounding an organization's environmental impact. They develop and implement policies, standards and procedures, and assign, coordinate and review the applied scientific work of the department or project teams. These employees typically have a master's or doctoral degree in environmental sciences or related field.

Legal

4112 — Lawyers and Quebec notaries

EXAMPLE TITLES : : :

- Lawyer
- Corporate counsel
- Legal advisor

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees may perform administrative and management functions related to the practice of law, and plead cases before courts of law, tribunals, and boards. Primarily, they advise clients, or their employer of their legal rights and all matters related to law. Most legal practitioners require a university degree, and lawyers specifically require a law degree and are licensed by the governing law society of their province.

Administration

1211 — Supervisors, general office and administrative support workers

EXAMPLE TITLES : : :

- Clerical supervisor
- Data entry supervisor
- Filing clerks supervisor
- Personnel clerks supervisor
- Records office supervisor
- Registry supervisor
- Switchboard operators supervisor

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These supervisors supervise, coordinate, assign and review the work of clerks engaged in the following duties: word processing; record keeping and filing; operating telephones and switchboards; data entry; desktop publishing; and other activities involving general office and administrative skills. They establish work schedules and procedures and coordinate activities with other work units or departments. Most have completed high school or several college courses.

1222 — Executive assistants

EXAMPLE TITLES : : :

- Executive Assistant

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees coordinate administrative procedures, public relations activities and research and analysis functions for executives, senior management, committees, and boards of directors. These employees normally have completed high school, and some have a bachelor's degree with related administrative experience.

1221 — Administrative officers

EXAMPLE TITLES : : :

- Administrative officer
- Administrative services coordinator
- Office administrator
- Office manager
- Administrative manager
- Office services coordinator
- Claims officer
- Administrative coordinator
- Project manager (non-technical)

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

These employees typically oversee and implement administrative procedures, establish work priorities, conduct analyses of administrative operations and coordinate acquisition of administrative services such as office space, supplies, and security services. Administrative officers who are supervisors are included in this unit group. Most of these employees have completed high school and may have a university degree or college diploma in a related field and have administrative experience.

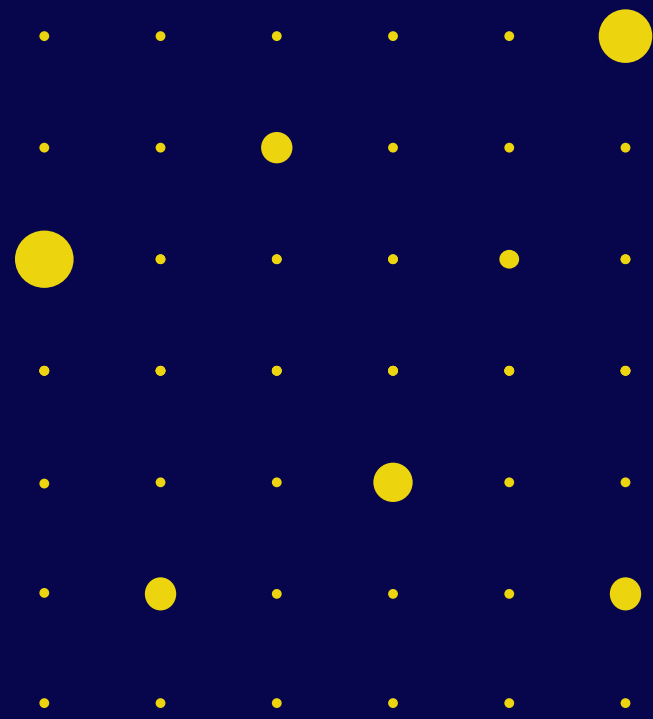
1241 — Administrative assistants

EXAMPLE TITLES : : :

- Administrative assistant
- Executive secretary
- Office administrative assistant
- Private secretary
- Secretary
- Technical secretary

How do I know if this is the right NOC Code?

Administrative assistants perform a variety of administrative duties in support of managerial and professional employers. They typically perform scheduling, correspondence, and minute-taking activities, among other administrative tasks. They have typically completed high school and might have completed a short administrative program.
